- Important topics, how all safety guidelines impacts students with special needs
 - Cannot exclude student due to not wearing facemask (SPED)
 - Needs to be determined by Special Populations committee
 - Specifically, how to handle if student cannot wear a mask
 - Concern over legal documents must be specific to students who have a formal plan (IEP/504)
 - Recommendation "Accommodations for students with a 504/IEP/medical action plan will be met and considered on a case-by-case basis."
 - Paraprofessionals Must have clear safety guidelines for working in a situation with a student w/o a mask
 - Clear mask protocols need to be created (many questions from community meeting)
 - Screening How will this look
 - Is this an administrative decision?
 - Staff interact with each student... temperature checks not as meaningful
 - Would a staff member walk through the screening form?
 - If not, there needs to be language as to why it may increase risk & include all measures that are being taken...
 - Screening should include visitors
 - Recommended to break into small groups
 - Send feedback to Bill concerning screening document
